Welcome to Year 1 Summer term. This term the children will be learning about a range of exciting and engaging subjects. Why not use the ideas below to support and motivate your child through the summer term

History - Great Fire of London

You could visit:

- Museum of London (with a dedicated exhibition)
- The Monument to the GFOL
- St Paul's Cathedral
- Role-Playing: Encourage your child to act out scenes from the Great Fire of London
- you can make a collage of flames using red, orange, and yellow tissue paper, or create a model of 17th-century London using cardboard, paint, and craft materials.



PSCHE - Caring for the Environment

- Go on a litter pick
- Make a poster for recycling at home
- Think of ways to save energy in school

Geography - Weather and Seasons

Why not visit:

- Winchester Science Centre
- Go for a nature walk on a sunny day, splash in puddles after a rainstorm, or build a snowman after a snowfall. These hands-on experiences will help your child connect with the natural world and appreciate the beauty of all types of weather.



English - Dragons

- Read a range of stories about Dragons
- Write a set of instructions about how to trap a Dragon
- Go on Dragon Hunts: Organize scavenger hunts or treasure hunts around your home or neighborhood with a dragon theme.



RE - Special Places

You could:

- Take children on a visit or tour to a Church or Synagogue
- The Western Wall (Kotel): Teach children about the significance of the Western Wall in Jerusalem, which is one of the holiest sites in Judaism.
- Draw your own special place you like to visit



PE - Athletics

Family Fitness Challenges:

Create family fitness challenges or obstacle courses that everyone can participate in together. Set up stations with different exercises or activities and challenge each other to complete them within a certain time frame.
