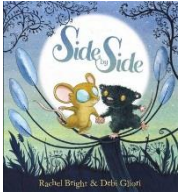

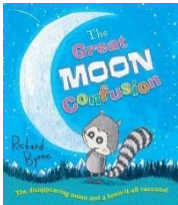

An autumn story about finding a friend to share things with. Wonderful illustrations.

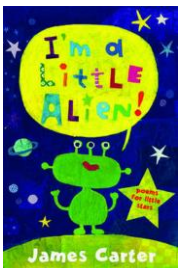

Are the bears stealing the moon? The racoon is convinced they are and tries to stop them.

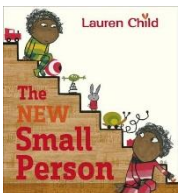

A good read aloud collection featuring aliens, space, the seaside, mermaids etc.

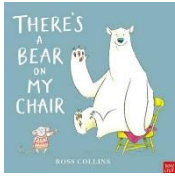

Award winning author at her best. Sibling rivalry is featured in this story as Elmore Green adapts to life with a new sibling.

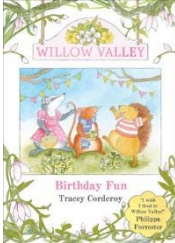

Y

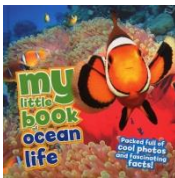
Great use of sounds making it perfect to read aloud. Fun combinations make this good for prediction. Can you extend the story?

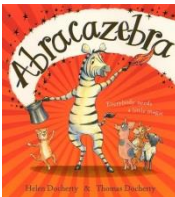

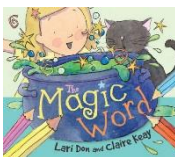
Good use of photographs and a low level text on a range of topics including space, oceans and sharks.

A new diary series which is a popular format. Text is interspersed with illustrations.

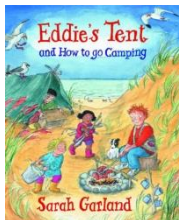

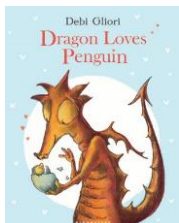
A combined story and information book all about new life, through planting seeds and waiting for the new baby to be born. Produced by the Eden Project.

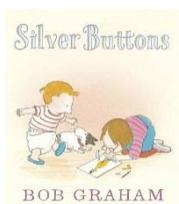
Another in this great series following on from Eddie's Garden/Toolbox/Kitchen. A lovely story beautifully illustrated with non-fiction text at the back of the book.

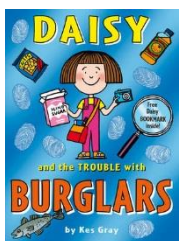
A story about adoption involving a dragon and a penguin. A lovely warm reassuring tale.

Y

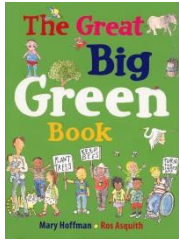
What happens in the world in the space of time it takes for a feather to float to the ground. This opens up a child's world beyond the familiar.

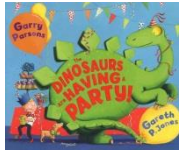
Daisy in yet more trouble! This engaging character is available both in chapter and picture book format.

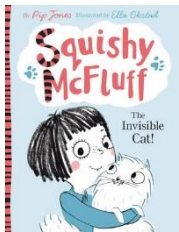
A first look at how everyone can help save the planet, illustrated with lots of amusing pictures.

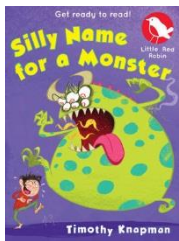
How exciting, a dinosaur party. But do the dinosaurs have an ulterior motive? Look closely at the pictures to find out. Great to read aloud with its rhyming text.

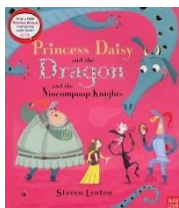
If you like this one, try the others. Rhyming text is fun and the illustrations complement the production. Good for newly established readers.

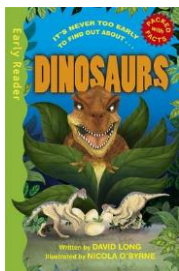
Part of the Little Red Robin: Get Ready to Read series. A longer text for this picture book writer. Good format with colourful pictures breaking up the text.

Y

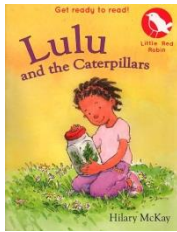

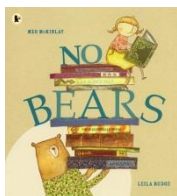

Y

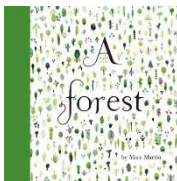
A book loving rabbit that steals to feed his addiction and is then introduced to the public library! Wonderful word play with examples of different forms of writing.

Y

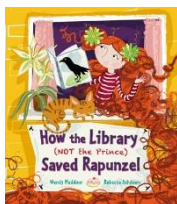
Ella wants to tell you a fairy tale but she is convinced that no bears can be in the tale. Full of humour as the bear tries to get a part.

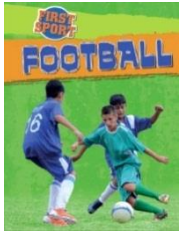
An alternative version of Rapunzel told in a rhyming text. In this story she discovers the public library and has no need to rely on a prince. Perfect for all budding librarians!

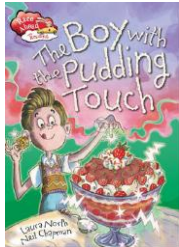

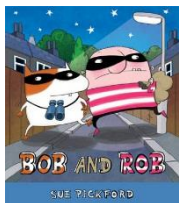
Part of the Race Ahead with Reading series. Zany illustrations accompany this fun text offering an alternative to the Midas touch.

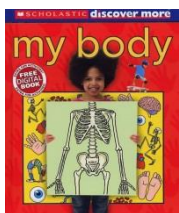

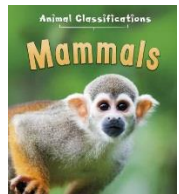
Alternative sides of the story are told by a girl and a wild beast. A funny and charming tale about seeing both sides of the story. A great choice for teaching point of view.

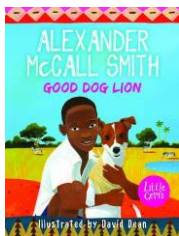
Great story full of humour from this master craftsman. The illustrations break up the text making it perfect for newly established readers. Can the cat keep the family under control?

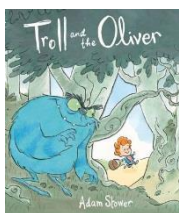
Clear presentation with lovely photographs.

Y

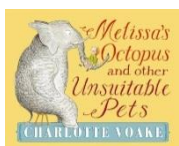
A wonderful retelling of the Three Billy Goats Gruff. Will the children be able to predict Oliver's fate? Try his next title Grumbug!

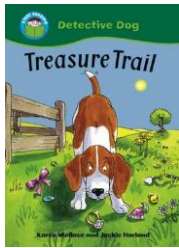

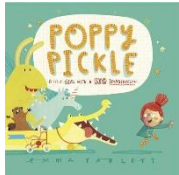
Who can come up with the most unsuitable pet? Melissa and her friends have trouble deciding which is the most unsuitable. Are you brave enough to read it?
