

SPRING 2025 OUTDOOR LEARNING

The children and Mr McGettigan are looking forward to the enriched and enhanced learning opportunities they will have through the spring term.

Please help me by packing my coat and wellies if I need them.

EYFS - Continuing to teach and deliver outdoor learning to small groups on a Thursday afternoon.

Year 1 will be learning outdoors through their Science focus in Spring 2, after half-term. This will be on a Wednesday afternoon.

Year 2 will be learning outdoors and building a good understanding of Materials for their Science journey. Year 2 will be having their outdoor learning session on a Wednesday afternoon.

Year 3 will be experiencing a range of outdoor learning experiences across the curriculum. Their sessions will be a small group on a Tuesday afternoon and whole class on a Friday morning.

Year 4 are linking their outdoor learning to the Ancient Egyptians to help them understand how they lived. Their session will be on a Monday afternoon.

Year 5 have Mr McGettigan on a Thursday morning. They will require suitable outdoor PE kit as they are learning about orienteering and other activities.

Year 6 will also be exploring learning through orienteering and problem solving with outdoor activities on a Friday afternoon. Don't forget outdoor P.E kit.

SPRING 2025 KIT LIST

It is essential that the children take part in outdoor learning and are well prepared. Please ensure your child comes to school with appropriate clothing to put on over their school uniform.



If I don't have my wellies my feet will get wet and I won't enjoy myself.

I must remember a coat and that it is waterproof.

Layers
It is important children wear layers in the Autumn and Winter months.

Your child will need at least 3 layers under their coat

- A vest or long sleeved top
- School shirt, polo shirt or blouse.
- A school jumper or fleece.

If it's cold put on extra layers rather than one thick top.

A hat will help to keep your whole body warm - wear one or make sure you have one in your coat pocket

Wellies will protect from puddles, mud, brambles and nettles. Wear thick socks or two pairs to keep your feet warm.

A waterproof jacket/coat with a hood will keep out the wind and the rain and protect you from nettles and thorns.

Waterproof trousers - If you have these they will help in the rain. Don't worry if you don't have any.

Gloves will keep your hands warm between activities.

If you are not in a position to provide extra outdoor clothing, please speak to your child's class teacher.

A pair of jogging trousers to go over your school trousers or change into will help keep legs warm.
