Year Group Information

Year R

The children have now completed the Spring term with us at school and we are all very proud of them and the achievements they have made. It has been a very busy end to the term with the completion of our work on Handa's Surprise. We enjoyed trying out the different fruits from the story and some of us even discovered we liked fruit we had not tasted before! The final excitement for the term was our trip out to Pinsent yesterday where the children were fantastic role models for the school and everyone was fully engaged in all of the different activities. We would like to say a big thank you to all of the parents who came along and helped us to provide a wonderful experience for the children. We hope you all have a lovely Easter break and we look forward to seeing the children back for the start of the Summer term.

Year 1

We find ourselves at the end of another term in which the children have continued to amaze and delight with their wonderful work and creative ideas. They have been working on counting in 2s, 5s and 10s in maths in preparation for next term where we will start multiplication. We have enjoyed being out in the lovely sunshine and tried to grab every chance to learn outside. We finished our topic of how to hide a lion by writing our own endings and the children have produced some outstanding writing. We even created some amazing fruits and vegetable salads in our DT workshops and enjoyed tasting them. We hope you have a wonderful and exciting break and we look forward to welcoming you all next term.

Year 2

What a packed half term we have had in Year 2! The children have enjoyed our Where the Wild Things Are focus and have written some fantastic stories based on the book as well as a non-chronological report based on a wild thing of their own design. In DT they made their own Wild Thing puppets and we would like to say a huge thank you to the volunteers who gave up some of their time to come and help the children with their sewing. As we had so many volunteers the morning was a great success and the children were so proud of their work. We will go and visit Early Years after Easter to share the puppets with them. We also linked our map work to the story with the children creating an island for Max that only had human features on it and an island for the wild things that only had physical (man-made) features on it. The children have worked incredibly hard this half term and are ready for a good rest over Easter. We look forward to seeing them again in a couple of weeks, refreshed and ready to go! Enjoy the break.

Year 3

The children have had so much fun immersing themselves in their English and History learning. Not only have they performed a Roman dance, but they have also written a speech for Queen Boudica and created beautiful mosaics. In Maths they have been learning about equivalent fractions and unit fractions, and we ask that support at home continues with the 3x, 4x and 8x tables. All have also had the chance to learn some golf skills this term, and while this unit comes to an end, we encourage you to continue at home over the holidays with a driving range visit or crazy golf, ask them what the trick is to 'take aim'. Following on from Parent Consultations, a few Maths resources for use at home – TT Rock Stars, One Minute Maths app and the website topmarks.co.uk are all age appropriate and easily accessible. We wish you all a happy and restful break and look forward to seeing you all again in the Summer term.

Year 4

The past two weeks have been full of exciting activities! Egyptian Day was a huge success, with the children showing incredible enthusiasm for the subject. They were engaged and curious, making it a day to remember. Additionally, we had a fantastic time creating soap sculptures with students from Winchester University, the children crafted beautiful fish sculptures, showcasing their artistic talents.

Another highlight was the children's interviews with a "nouka," where they incorporated humour and thoughtful questions into their writing. It's been wonderful to watch them develop new skills and confidence.

Year 5

In a blink of an eye, the end of term is here! Over the past two weeks we have wrapped up our unit on decimals, fractions and percentages in maths. It's been a busy time, but the children have really grasped the concepts, and it's fantastic to see their progress. In English, we've also completed our study on *Hidden Figures*, with Katherine Johnson's memoirs inspiring the children. It's wonderful to hear how they now want to watch the film, bring life to their learning. As we look ahead, we're excited to delve into the world of *Avatar* and explore Pandora. The children have already started word banks, focusing on the various areas of Pandora and its unique inhabitants. We were fortunate enough to be invited to Wesley Methodist Church for an interactive session on 'Easter is'. Sam Barnes for the church came into school to discuss the Easter story with us, the children were fully immersed and engaged in all of the activities. Wishing you all a restful Easter break; let's hope the weather stays sunny and warm for some lovely family time.

Year 6

Over the past two weeks, Year 6 has fully immersed themselves in *Macbeth*! The children have stepped into Macbeth's shoes, writing letters to Lady Macbeth explaining the witches' prophecy and the treasonous thoughts swirling in his mind. We've also held a lively debate and written a balanced argument on who is the most villainous character—Macbeth or Lady Macbeth. The discussions have been thought-provoking, and the writing has been fantastic! In **Maths**, we have been working through our **Statistics** unit, exploring bar models, pie charts, line graphs, and calculating the mean average. The children have shown great confidence in interpreting and representing data. In **PE**, our gymnastics sessions have seen the children choreograph their own sequences, demonstrating creativity and control. Meanwhile, in **tennis**, they have been sharpening their forehand, backhand, and serves. In **Music**, we have been delving into the **Blues**, exploring the **12-bar blues, chords, scales**, and even trying our hand at **improvisation**!

It has been a busy and exciting fortnight—well done to all the children for their hard work!
