Year Group Information

Year R

The children have had a busy few weeks in school and they have continued to amaze us with how well they have adapted to lots of new routines. We have begun our Guided Reading sessions which run alongside our Phonics sessions and the children have been very enthusiastic about bring the books home. The books need to be returned every Thursday so we are able to change them over, this also applies to the library book they bring home as our library session is also on a Thursday. Yesterday we had our first Relax Kids session with Jules which we enjoyed very much. We got to go into the yurt and take part in the session in front of the log burner; a perfect way to relax! We hope you all have a relaxing weekend and we look forward to seeing the children back in school on Tuesday.

Year 1

It's been a fantastic and busy couple of weeks in Year 1! The children have been full of curiosity and creativity, and we're excited to share some highlights from our learning across subjects. This fortnight, we have been working hard to understand the concept of *part-whole* relationships in maths. Using practical resources like counters and number frames, the children have been learning how numbers can be split into parts and then put back together. They've shown fantastic reasoning skills when explaining their thinking and are becoming confident in using part-whole models to solve simple addition problems. Inspired by the classic story *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*, Year 1 have been busy planning and writing their very own version: *We're Going on a Spider Hunt!* From swishy, swashy grass to creepy, cobwebbed wood pile, the children have been using rich vocabulary and creative sentence starters to bring their stories to life. We've been so impressed with their imagination and enthusiasm for storytelling! In art, we have been sharpening our observation skills by closely studying different types of fruit. The children have been using pencils to explore line, shape, and texture, carefully drawing what they see rather than what they think it looks like. The results have been fantastic – we clearly have some budding artists in Year 1! This term in RE, we've been learning about the importance of Harvest and the value of thankfulness. The children have enjoyed learning about where our food comes from and discussing ways we can show gratitude and share with others. We've had some lovely conversations about giving, helping, and caring for those in need.

Year 2

We have had a busy couple of weeks where the children have continued to learn more about Florida. They have been thinking about what they can see and do in different areas within Florida, have learnt about the key geographical features and have identified the human (man-made) and physical (natural) features of each area. In English the children have been learning to recite a poem called 'The Star' by Jane Taylor and have been using actions to support them with this. This morning they performed the poem to Year 1 and did an amazing job. The children have also written their own alliterative poems about Space using adjectives and nouns to create their phrases. Thank you for bringing in your teddy bears as part of our Art topic. Just a polite reminder that children should be returning their reading and library books every Friday. Many thanks for your support.

Year 3

What a great few weeks! The children have been enjoying lots of practical and mental maths for addition and subtraction, building on their Year 2 number facts knowledge. We have also shown the children how to log into Doodle Maths and their log-ins should have come home. Doodle maths is a fantastic app which, when used regularly, really helps children to develop as mathematicians. In English we continue to read *Arthur and The Golden Rope*. The children have enjoyed writing character descriptions for the monstrous wolf Fenrir and writing a diary extract as our main character Arthur as he begins his quest to save his town. We have introduced the children to our SORA library app this week and launched the whole school Bookopoly challenge, so get reading! In DT we have been researching and designing packaging, building 3D shapes and designing are own nets.

Year 4

Zoom - another two weeks have flown by and we have crammed so much in, in year 4. The children have created their own Anglo-Saxon in history and their own hero in English. We have begun to study Beowulf and will be writing our own Hero Myth over the next couple of weeks. Leading into this, we have been investigating similes, fronted adverbials and expanded noun phrases to ensure our writing is beautifully descriptive. We also had an inspirational visit from author Emma Swan as an extra incentive for our writing.

We have just begun to think about making a healthy smoothie in DT - trying to blend, taste, looks, health and cost to come up with the perfect drink. We've been singing with the Vikings and uncovered the mystery of Sutton Hoo; Our science 'Eggsperiment' came to a smelly conclusion and taught us about drinks that are bad for our teeth; we've contemplated temptation in RE and improved our fitness and netball skills in PE. What a packed couple of weeks! In the words of Depeche Mode, we 'Just Can't Get Enough' in year 4!

Year 5

The past few weeks have truly flown by – you know what they say, time flies when you're having fun! We're progressing through our class text 'Millions,' which continues to act as a fantastic stimulus for our reading and writing sessions. We've just wrapped up writing informal letters packed with persuasive devices, and now we're shifting gears to create our own instructions on how to make lasagne, just like the characters in the story. To top it off, some of our children even had the chance to follow a set of instructions and make a lasagne themselves – and yes, the children got to enjoy the delicious results! In maths, we've successfully completed our units on place value and are now tackling the addition and subtraction column method, along with rounding and using inverse operations to check our answers. In art, the children have been delving into self-portraits, exploring the work of British artist Chila Kumari Burman. They've created vibrant collage backgrounds and crafted poetry portraits using carbon paper. History continues to be engaging as we explore 'Crime and Punishment.' We're answering fascinating questions like whether one would have liked to be a highwayman and examining what constitutes a witch, alongside the notorious Bloody Code detailing the 200 crimes punishable by hanging in the 18th century.

Year 6

Residential in Osmington Bay

First and foremost, the children had an absolutely *brilliant* time on their residential trip to Osmington Bay. The weather was fantastic, and the children fully embraced all the activities, which included everything from rock climbing to team challenges. It was a great opportunity for the children to push themselves outside of their comfort zones, and they did so with enthusiasm and a positive attitude.

One of the things that stood out most was how the children embodied our school values throughout the week. They showed *kindness, responsibility, respect, and excellence* in everything they did. Whether it was supporting each other during activities or working together in teams, they truly represented the spirit of our school. They were an absolute joy to take away!

We also have to mention the food – it was *incredible*! The children enjoyed a wide variety of delicious meals, and they certainly came back well-fed and happy.

This Week's Learning

Back at school, the children have settled back into their learning routine with great energy. In maths, they've been tackling *short division* and *long division* – both of which have been great challenges for them. The children have worked hard to grasp these important concepts and are beginning to feel more confident in applying them. In English, they've been writing a letter of advice to Zoe, a character from one of our class books, about how she should escape *Eel's Island*. In Science, the children explored the school ground on an invertebrate hunt. Lastly, in PE, the children have continued to sharpen their skills in football and looking at different ways you can adapt the rules of dodgeball.

Monday 20th (and through the week)

The Digital Dilemma- Regional Cyber Crime Team

Whilst many other crimes types are declining, in our digital age Cyber Crime is on the rise and is frequently cited as a top concern amongst our communities.

The Regional Police Cyber Crime team are running webinars to help you, as parents and carers, to keep you and your family safe in today's cyber landscape. We'll equip you with easy-to-implement steps to protect your loved ones in the digital age, while mitigating online harm. What you need to know, without the technical jargon.

There will be two different topics covered across these webinars:

Cyber Protect sessions focus on cyber security best practice for you and your family, social media safety, gaming risks and highlights some of the parental controls you can put in place to minimise online harm for your children.

The Cyber Choices webinar will explain the Cyber Choices intervention programme, which aims to support you in safeguarding against the risks of your children from becoming involved in committing computer misuse crimes, and will teach you some of the signs and symptoms to look out for as well as giving an understanding of the legal boundaries surrounding computer misuse.

Each session will have an interactive Q&A at the end.

Tuesday 21st

Introduction to Non-Violent Resistance (NVR) Training. Youth Options- Vikki Hill

Our bespoke support for families across Hampshire experiencing challenging behaviours including violence, school refusal, self-harm and risk taking. During the two-hour taster session, you will gain an understanding of what NVR is and how it can be adapted to all ages and needs of individual young people.

We will look at a brief history of NVR how it can be adapted for individuals or family specific needs. We will introduce you to some of the 'tools' of NVR.

You will get to hear 'honest' messages from parents who have completed the course and will hopefully be able to learn a little about yourself and take away a 'new' technique to try at home. NVR works on the principle that old authority is no longer working with many of our young people but that does not mean no authority, or not addressing challenging behaviour that is affecting your family. Instead NVR promotes a new kind of authority.

Our session will be led by one of our accredited practitioners who has been working with NVR principles for over 7 years.

Wednesday 22nd

Take Control of Your Money: Simple Skills for Everyday Life- Sacha Welch, Citizens Advice

Money worries affect many of us, but with a few simple money management skills, it's possible to stay in control and reduce the stress of making ends meet. Our interactive and engaging workshop will look at some simple steps you can take such as creating—and sticking to—a monthly budget, finding ways to cut everyday costs (for food and household bills), and being aware of possible financial support that you could be entitled to. These simple steps can all make a real difference.

In the workshop, you'll also learn tips on how to make smart decisions about your money, avoid debt, and work towards your personal goals—whether that's saving for something important or preparing for an unexpected expense.

Helping children to thrive at School and Home – Lorraine Lee

A 45 minute online workshop exploring specific, practical tools and strategies parents can use to help their children succeed at school and home.

The tools support children to feel capable and confident, follow instructions, manage boundaries, interact with others, try new things, and recover from setbacks.

The session will be led by Lorraine Lee, a professional parenting practitioner with a background in child development and psychology.

Dr Sarah Coles Team Leader: Hampshire Ethnic Minority and Traveller Achievement Service (EMTAS) Multilingual children and families in Hampshire schools

Altogether, over 160 different languages are spoken by Hampshire children and their families. This often leads to questions. Knowing their child is taught in English at school, some parents wonder if they should switch to English at home too; others worry that speaking other languages will slow their child's progress or confuse their child. Many feel they can't help their child with school work because they don't know what is being taught at school.

If you have questions like these, or if you just want to know more about the benefits of bringing up your child in more than one language, come and learn more about how EMTAS can support your family.



Clare Fernyhough is a Hampshire mum and co-founder of **Smartphone Free Childhood** - a movement on a mission to change the culture around children and smartphones, and protect childhood for longer.
