## Year Group Information

### Year R

We have reached the end of the children's first half term in school and we cannot believe how quickly the time has flown by. They have all made a great start to their school journey and we are very proud of them. Over the past couple of weeks we have been focussing on 'The Gingerbread Man' and have had great fun re-telling the story as well as making our own Gingerbread people. We even got to taste gingerbread and thought of ways to describe what it tasted like! We have also completed the first six weeks of our phonics programme and will begin the second part of phase 2 after half term. In Maths we have been looking at subitising numbers and explaining how we know how many there are in a group without counting them. We hope you all have a lovely half term break and we look forward to welcoming the children back for the second part of the Autumn term.

### Year 1

As we approach the end of a wonderful half term, we wanted to take a moment to share with you all the exciting things we've been up to in Year 1. From exploring new books to exciting hands-on science experiments, it's been a term full of learning and fun!

#### English: A Rhyme and a Book

In English, we've been having so much fun with the book "**Oi Frog!**" by Kes Gray. It's been a delight to read about frogs, dogs, and the wacky world they live in. We even wrote our own rhyming sentences, inspired by the silly animals in the story.

#### Maths: Part-Whole Equations and Number Bonds

In Maths, we've been working hard with **part-whole equations**. We've learned how numbers come together to make a whole and how to break them apart! We used **number bonds** to work systematically, helping us understand how numbers fit together, just like pieces of a puzzle. Whether it's  $10 + 3$  or  $5 + 2$ , we're all getting better at finding the missing part! Here's an example:

#### Science: Materials Galore!

In Science, we had a fantastic time exploring different **materials**. We tested their **absorbency**, **transparency**, and **strength**, and made some interesting discoveries! From sponges soaking up water to finding out which materials could hold the most weight, it was a fun and hands-on way to learn. Ask your child about the **strongest material** they tested, or which one they thought would be the best for making a raincoat!

#### Art: Autumn Pumpkins

In Art, we embraced the colours of autumn and created beautiful **pumpkin pieces**. With bright oranges, yellows, and greens, each pumpkin became a masterpiece. We loved using different textures and materials to make them stand out. What a fantastic way to celebrate the season!

As we wrap up this half term, we want to thank you for your continued support. It's been a brilliant few weeks, and we've loved seeing how much the children have grown in their learning. We wish you all a restful and well-deserved half-term break, filled with fun and relaxation.

### Year 2

What a fantastic first half term we have had with the children, they have all worked so hard and are now ready for a well deserved break! Over the last couple of weeks the children have been learning all about how they change as they grow and had visits from a baby, toddler and some Early Years children. They loved being able to ask questions to find out more about what they can do at the different stages of development. Last week the children had a visit from a mysterious visitor who they later discovered was Bob the Man on the Moon. They have been learning how to write questions this week so they can interview him after half term. We hope you enjoy half term and look forward to seeing the children back at school in a week's time.

### Year 3

As we arrive at the first half term, the children have had a great start to Year 3 and have enjoyed wowing you with their writing and Maths books during Parent Consultations. Over the last few weeks, they have enjoyed their local walk where they looked at the land use of our local area, they have made leaflets about land use and looked at lots of different types of maps. Ask them about Google Earth and see if they can spot different areas of land use. We have ended a great week with International Day where Elm Class studied The Netherlands and Larch Class learnt about Brazil. Both classes have enjoyed guest speakers, presentations and art projects. We hope you enjoy viewing some of their work in the Hall after school. If you missed it, check out for our school's social media. We hope that you all have a happy and restful break.

#### Year 4

Anglo-Saxon day was a great success this week with the children showing great resilience when learning how to weave and create Saxon brooches - fully immersing themselves in the hardships of living over a thousand years ago. Science saw us learning about the process of digestion and the children took great pleasure in simulating the digestive system, mixing up the food and squeezing it through our tights-based small intestines before squeezing out the waste... We continue to sing our Viking songs in music and our Spanish is now muy bien! We've begun exploring Scratch in computing, the beginnings of learning coding and have been thinking about temptation in RE. International day saw us investigating Diwali and India with the children creating Diyas and Rangoli patterns. What an amazing couple of weeks we have had.

#### Year 5

As we come to the end of the first half term, we wanted to say a huge well done to the year 5 children. They settled in well and quickly, worked hard and now deserve a well-earned rest. In English we have concluded Millions with writing instructions for lasagne. This week the children have been introduced to our new stimulus -The Dreamgiver- a short film and writing some impressive descriptions of the main character. In maths we have started our new unit- multiplication and division, therefore learning times tables is a must. In outdoor pursuits, the children took part in den building, fire making and whitening or kayaking. A lot of fun was had by all. International day concludes this half term where the children learnt about the culture and heritage of Jamaica and Nepal. It was wonderful to see so many children dressed in their national dress or in red, white and blue. Thank you to our parents for your efforts and the children for making it another memorable day.

#### Year 6

It's been a busy and exciting fortnight in Year 6, filled with learning, creativity, and collaboration! Our brilliant mathematicians have been working incredibly hard on short and long division, showing great perseverance and progress. They've also tackled the rule of BIDMAS (Brackets, Indices, Division, Multiplication, Addition, Subtraction), sharpening their problem-solving skills. To challenge themselves further, the children have tested their knowledge using previous SATs papers. In English, the children have been captivated by the novel *Floodland*. With great excitement, they've now finished reading it and have written their own imaginative endings based on predictions made during class discussions. Their creativity and insight have truly shone through in their writing! PE has been a hive of activity! The children have been designing and teaching their own dodgeball games, showing leadership and teamwork. They've also enjoyed putting their football skills to the test in small-sided matches, demonstrating fantastic sportsmanship and enthusiasm.

International Day was a highlight for everyone!

- **Sycamore Class** explored the vibrant culture of **South Africa**, learning about its history, traditions, and art. They created stunning African-inspired artwork that showcased their creativity.
- **Pine Class** journeyed to the beautiful island of **St Lucia**, diving into its carnival traditions and crafting colourful, carnival-inspired masks that brought the classroom to life.

We're so proud of all the children for their hard work, curiosity, and creativity this half term. Thank you for your continued support — we look forward to sharing more exciting updates with you soon!
