13/3/26 We have been having a 'wild' time in Year 2 over the past 3 weeks with much of our learning linked to our new story 'Where the Wild Things Are'. It all started with a visit from the Wild Things who wrecked the school yurt while looking for their King, Max! The children have thoroughly enjoyed learning the story through repeated re-reading and drama activities. They are now writing their own stories using the language from the original text, but changing either the character or setting, and have made a fantastic start. In DT the children are going to make their own Wild Thing puppets to help retell the story, and have spent this week carrying out some focused practical tasks to learn different methods for joining materials together. In maths we have been focusing on length, mass and capacity using practical resources to support the children with their learning. **On Thursday 26th March the children will be sewing their puppets together and we would like to ask for volunteers to come in and support us with this session. 24/4/26 The children have made a fantastic start to the summer term and have been immersing themselves into their new history topic, which is all about Mary Anning. They have heard several stories about Mary, looked at several non-fiction texts about her life and discoveries and used these texts to identify the features non-fiction texts have. In maths the children have continued to learn about fractions, thinking about how to find a half, quarter and three quarters of a number. We are now revisiting addition and subtraction over the next few weeks using apparatus, pictures and then number lines to support the children's calculations. Over the next few weeks we will start our new art topic where we will build up the skills we need to create our own clay tile which will be fossil themed.
